Her request was being granted and for my mother this meant peace of mind.</p> <p>Knowing that she could go on her own terms and choose the time of her death with her loved ones around was very important to her and made her feel she still had some dignity and choice. "Knowing the MAID date" allowed the community to come together and all the people important to her to be with her, have conversations about death and dying and talk about the many beautiful live events we shared together. Everything was said that needed to be said and we could all focus on making her passing as meaningful and loving as possible.</p> <p>In the end, a couple of days before the MAID procedure (in the Netherlands in 1995 this was called active Euthanasia) my mother ended up passing away as a result of what was then called "passive euthanasia", treatment had been stopped a few days prior to her MAID date. For me as a young adult, watching my mother go through this process was a very positive experience. Along with the pain of loss, I felt such relief that her suffering was finally over and was grateful that I was able to be with her on those last days.
